Have you ever wanted to know how healthy the water in your creek or stream is? Do you know why pH, dissolved oxygen, and phosphorous are important factors in water quality? Well, now is your chance to learn about water quality monitoring and test your own stream or creek!

The Allen County Partnership for Water Quality is hosting several Hoosier Riverwatch workshops for citizens who are interested in learning more about water quality monitoring. Hoosier Riverwatch is a state-sponsored water quality monitoring initiative started in 1994 to increase public awareness of water quality issues and concerns by training volunteers to monitor stream water quality.

You can attend a one-day workshop that will equip you with all the information and resources you need to survey your water quality and become a part of this water protection initiative. This is a great program for schools, churches, and civic groups to become involved in bettering our community's water quality.
